

Security Tips for a Safe and On-Time Closing



Fraudsters are leveraging the latest technology. You should be too. Review this checklist and ensure you're following security best practices to protect your sensitive information.

- Use a **secure portal** for all tasks related to your closing, including **document sharing and messaging**, instead of email
- Enable **two-factor authentication (2FA)** wherever possible
- Use a **password manager** such as 1Password or BitWarden to generate and manage passwords. Do not keep passwords written on paper
- Use a **unique, long, and complex password** for every device and application used for your closing. Do not reuse passwords
- Flag **suspicious or urgent money requests** to your settlement agency
- Raise a red flag to your settlement agency if you are asked to provide funds in a way that contradicts wire instructions you've previously received
- Call to **verify wire instructions** with your settlement agency prior to sending any funds
- Beware of **email phishing scams**
- If you do receive an email message, check the sender's **email domain** for 100% accuracy, and do not click any links or open attachments that come from an unknown party
- Periodically **review login activity** for your email account to see if there's been any suspicious activity
- Promptly install** all browser and operating system updates to ensure your computer's defenses are up-to-date
